

About Our Summer Trips

Medical Treatment Release Form

Each participant attending a summer trip must have a Medical Treatment Release Form on file with the parish. Each form is good for a year and expire in August.

Age Requirement

Each camp and trip has different age requirements. Each participant must make the minimum age requirement and be no older than the maximum age. When grade levels are specified use the grade the participant will be in the fall of 2012.

Trips Fees

All trips have fee deadlines. Failure to follow a deadline jeopardizes the spot for the participant. Most sponsoring organization require non-refundable deposits along with registration fees that are paid in installments. If a spot in not fully paid sponsoring organizations will cancel that spot. Most registration fees are refundable up to a point (minus the deposit). All deposits are transferable. That means if you drop and the spot is filled you can get a full refund. If the spot is not filled you will not get back the deposit. If the drop is less then a month from the trip you will likely get no money back.

Scholarships

Scholarship money may become available. Cost should not be the reason why you are unable to attend a camp.

According to Catholic Heart Workcamp’s policy unpaid spots will be dropped. These spots can be lost
