Hello everybody!

As our seasons begin to change again I am reminded of how life continues to press on as I encounter all of the beautiful vistas that it has to offer. The trees in front of the rectory are beginning to change to those beautiful shades of red that I so greatly appreciate and look forward to every year and the geese and turkeys are back in the cemetery. As the salmon begin their migration up our rivers I remember those simpler times in life when I was a child and the only thing I had to worry about was if there were enough snagging hooks in the tackle box for the weekend (f.y.i: snagging was legal then). The smells of the fireplace in the autumn wind, Lions football, and a good pot roast for dinner at half time...My favorite time of year!

Things continue to change in the Church as well because she is the living, breathing Bride of Christ! Advent is just around the corner and this year we will experience some pretty significant changes in our Mass as outlined by the Roman Missal... the red book that is used during Mass. When the "big changes" occurred with the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council one of those changes was the use of the vernacular in the liturgies of the Church. Immediately there was an effort to translate all of the Latin texts used into English and every other language under the sun. With these efforts in translation came the language that we use today in the Mass which a "loose" and informal translation of the original Latin texts...this is especially true in the English translation. As a result, the Church has asked us to implement a more formal translation of the original Latin texts beginning this November which will link the English translation more closely with all of the other translations. What a beautiful opportunity for us as individuals and as Church! Words that have become so comfortable for us that we don't have to concentrate as we say them will now take some concentration and effort to pray at Mass. Those of you who remember the Latin Mass will hear a more familiar language as we use a more formal language...remember the *mia culpa?*

I am excited! Fall is almost here and the Church continues to grow and move and have her being!
